Our Garden Club is a fun, hands-on community initiative to teach our students about fresh, seasonal, and delicious food so they form positive food habits for life, as well as foster a deeper connection to the natural world. It also encourages other important life skills such as cooperation, problem-solving and creative thinking; and it rewards students with increased self-esteem and personal pride in achievement. Through working with gardening enthusiasts and multiple volunteers, often spanning generations, our program not only utilises the expertise of our community, but also provides our students with opportunities to learn through wonderfully enriching intergenerational conversations.

Students can wear either Jolly Socks they have purchased or their own socks, please bring a gold coin donation. Full PE uniform is still to be worn.


