#### A great beginning

We joyfully welcome all new and returning families and staff to our school community, and we look forward to working collaboratively throughout the 2024 school year.

We have been blessed with a very positive and settled start to the year. For many of us, our 2024 Foundation students are among the most settled beginning cohort we have experienced - they are amazing! It is hard to believe they have only been at school for eight days.

Thank you to all students, staff and parents for your wonderful start to the school year. The beautiful weather has certainly enhanced our beginning.

So much learning has already taken place over the past two weeks as students have got to know their new teachers, reconnected friendships or begun new ones, become familiar with new routines, and look forward to new opportunities to grow in their new year levels.

This week saw our MultiLit program (MacqLit for Years 3-6 and MiniLit for the junior years) begin across all year levels. Our facilitators report all groups are off to a great start.

#### **Staff Professional Learning**

For our staff, the year began with a week of professional learning before the students came back. The week started with all staff exploring Spiritual Formation off-site with Pastor David Spike. This was followed by a day of First Aid and Emergency Management training by external trainers. The final days for our teachers were dedicated to intensive learning in Structured Literacy (Science of Reading), incorporating specific strategies to meet the needs of the differing developmental stages of our students. Very exciting!!!! Working in Professional Learning Teams, our staff will continue to undertake weekly units of learning together throughout the semester to ensure outstanding practice in Literacy acquisition for our students.

Our Learning Coaches also completed evidence-based pedagogy training during this week. This training will further enhance the learning support our students' receive, which is the vital role our coaches fulfil.

#### Visit to our School

On Tuesday, the 6th, TLS had a visit from Jan and Gudrun Schurmann, who travelled all the way from Osnabruck in Germany. Jan has a unique connection to Tarrington Lutheran School as he is related to the founding principal, Clamor Schurmann, and actually grew up in the same house in Germany where Clamor also lived during his childhood. Jan took the time to share his life journey with our Year 5 and 6 students. His journey took him from growing up on his family's farm to becoming a detective, then a lawyer and a law lecturer, and eventually led him to work for the UN, where he provided support to countries in crisis, including Afghanistan.
