## IN THE CLASSROOM

## YEAR 3

#### **Project Based Learning**

The Year 3 and 4 classes commenced construction of their dioramas last week. This term we have been learning about the many types of environments around the world, and comparing environments (biomes) in some continents with those in Australia. The students have shown creativity and teamwork as they form the displays that they will use to present their research into a particular environment, along with an endangered plant or animal from that environment.

#### **Structured Literacy**

After reading Bowerbird Blues at National Simultaneous Storytime, students have begun to present information about Satin Bowerbirds as Information Reports. Students chose a medium to present their work, either handwritten, typed as a document or as a PowerPoint Presentation. They are showcasing their skills with adjectives and adverbs throughout their work.















## YEAR 5/6 EXCURSION

On Wednesday, the Year 5/6 class visited Mulleraterong in Hamilton as part of our current Project-Based Learning (PBL) project. During the visit, students interacted with staff members and clients while seeing the facilities on offer.

The focus of our project, "Uniquely Able," is to highlight the strengths and gifts of individuals with disabilities, showcasing that despite differences, everyone has unique abilities. This was highlighted during our visit by witnessing the remarkable artwork created by one of the residents. Furthermore, we observed how many residents contribute positively to our local community through recycling programs and assisting with Meals on Wheels. Seeing the talent and creativity displayed in several paintings by a client who was recently featured in the Hamilton Spectator was another example.

It was great to observe the variety of sensory items available to the clients, which aligns perfectly with the practical aspects of our project.







## **GREAT EXPLORATIONS**

During the Last Great Explorations event, the children engaged in a literacy experience with Mrs. Ange McAllister. They read "Bowerbird Blues" by Aura Parker and participated in various activities, including creating bowerbirds, crafting collages of blue items, and making bird feeders. It was a delightful experience for everyone involved.
