














HONOURABLE DAN TEHAN VISITS TLS

GARDEN CLUB

Today in Garden Club with Mrs. Lucy Cameron, the Year 1 students explored biomes and the living creatures found in compost soil. The children counted and tallied the number of worms in two scoops of compost, discovering an impressive 67 worms! They also searched through the soil for other life forms, finding earwigs, hookworms, slater bugs, and various other insects. Afterward, we made compost tea by placing stinging nettles, weeds, and compost into a pillowcase and soaking it in a large bucket of water. Conveyance Allowance

If you live more than 4.8 km's from your nearest bus stop, which you use to attend Tarrington Lutheran School, you may be eligible for a Conveyance Allowance payment from the Department of Education and Training (DET). The purpose of this allowance is to ensure that schools support eligible families to receive financial assistance with the cost of transporting students to and from school.

Child Safety at TLS - National Child Protection Week

Next week is National Child Protection Week. At TLS, there is nothing more important than the safety and wellbeing of our students. We place our commitments under the Child Safe Standards at the top of our priorities as a school. As part of this commitment, our staff regularly undertake training regarding the standard and the actions to be taken to maintain a Child Safe environment.

Our students are also educated so that they know what to do if ever they feel unsafe. To help with this, these two resources are discussed with our students.

It is important that our families are also aware of the part they play in creating a Child Safe environment. All adults volunteering on a regular basis at the School should undertake our online Child Safe training. Please contact our Administration Office for assistance.

You may notice that our teachers are guiding our students to offer high fives/fist bumps/arm taps/handshakes in preference to a hug. While hugging is not a practice that teachers and staff at TLS have actively encouraged, in keeping with our obligations and these new standards, we are required to minimise physical contact with students. There are times when physical contact is appropriate, such as a brief side hug to comfort an extremely distressed child, or holding a child to keep them from danger.
